The Griffin family picture theatre and the Wonderview de Luxe 1923 Beach Theatre were built.

Electric light was extended to private homes.

- Electricity connected to Granite Island. 1924
- The tennis clubhouse was built on the foreshore. 1925
- 1926 New railway station built.
- 1927 Second Newland Memorial Congregational Church in Victoria St completed.
- 1928 The Masonic Lodge was built on Hindmarsh Rd. Castlemaine was built for Sir William Sowden. Scouts' and Guides' Halls were opened. Road to Adelaide sealed.
- South Coast District Hospital opened. 1929
- The Convent of Mercy School was opened. 1930 The Church of Christ was opened in Seaview Rd.
- 1933 The Salvation Army Citadel was opened in Victoria St.
- 1934 Griffin family picture theatre burnt down.
- State centenary celebrations at Victor Harbor. 1936 Grand Prix attracted 40 000 spectators.
- The Bluff and surroundings declared a recreation reserve. 1938
- The Amscol Dairy Factory was built on Adelaide Rd. It closed in 1978 1941 with the building converted to the Lutheran Church Centre.
- A new Newland bridge over the Inman River was completed. 1948
- 1954 The Methodist Church was established at Adare.

The horse tram ceased running and was replaced by a tractor train until 1986 when the horse tram resumed.

- 1955 The public baths and Victoria Pier were demolished after storm damage.
- A new Hotel Victor was built 1961
- Council Chambers on Bay Rd opened. 1965
- 1969 Meals on Wheels established at Victor Harbor.

Granite Island declared a Fauna Sanctuary.

- 1971 Deep drainage installed in the town.
- The Corporation of Victor Harbor and the District Council of 1975 Encounter Bay amalgamated to form District Council of Victor Harbor.
- 1976 Urimbirra Wildlife Park opened on land given to Victor Harbor, later on run by a private enterprise.
- Nangawooka Flora Reserve established as a community project. 1982
- 1984 The Primary School on Torrens St closed and a new one opened on The Parkway in 1985.
- National Trust was granted use of Old Customs House as a museum. 1986

- Tourist Information Centre first opened in the Old School House. 1989 Council donated land adjoining the Council Chamber to Meals on Wheels.
- 1991 Around 125 000 people visited Victor Harbor to see the whales.
- Granite Island sea lion sculpture carved by Silvio Apponyi. 1992
- 1993 The Whale Tail Fountain by Silvio Apponyi was installed.
- 1994 Horse tram centenary and opening of the Tram Barn.

Whale Centre opened in the old railway goods shed.

- 1996 A Penguin Interpretive Centre was established.
- The chairlift on Granite Island, erected in 1964, was removed. 1996
- Encounter Coast Discovery Centre was built adjacent to the 1997 Customs House by the Victor Harbor Branch of The National Trust.

The Rotary clock, celebrating 50 years of Rotary in Victor Harbor, was erected in Temple Gardens.

- Tourist Information Centre moved to the Causeway kiosk building. 1998
- 2001 Launch of the Kondoli sculpture at the Kleinigs Hill Lookout. This was a joint project between the Victor Harbor R-7 School and Fregon Anangu Aboriginal School.

District Council of Victor Harbor became City of Victor Harbor.

2002 Sculpture, On Occupied Territories, designed by Margaret Worth to commemorate the meeting between Flinders and Baudin, was opened.

Ring Road west of the city was constructed.

Approximately 90 formally identified Local Heritage listed Places created.

- 2007 Opening of the new Council Chambers on the site of the 1965 Building, incorporating the library.
- 2009 The Bluff Boat Ramp opened for upgrade.
- McLaren Lane was created to provide a walkway between Ocean 2012 Street and Railway Terrace.

Causeway Plaza upgrade completed.

2014 150 years anniversary of the Victor Harbor to Port Elliot Railway Line.

32 Blue coloured heritage interpretation plaques were installed on State and Local Heritage listed Places around the town centre.

HISTORICAL FACTS ON VICTOR HARBOR











- **1802** Encounter Bay discovered and named by Capt Matthew Flinders in the ship Investigator after his encounter with Capt Nicolas Baudin in the Geographe near the Murray Mouth.
- **1830** Captain Sturt & his party reached the Murray Mouth.
- **1836** South Australia proclaimed as a British Province by Capt John Hindmarsh, Governor.
- **1837** Two whaling stations established, one at the Bluff and the other near the site of the railway crossing on Hindmarsh Rd.

Capt R Crozier in HMS Victor anchored in the lee of Granite Island and named Victor Harbor.

Mootaparinga Cottage established for the Hindmarsh family

- 1838 Port Victor was proclaimed on June 26.
- **1839 Rev R W Newland and his party,** first permanent settlers, arrived at Encounter Bay aboard the brig Lord Hobart on July 4.

Amalgamation of the two whaling stations.

The Bluff named Rosetta Head by Governor Gawler.

- **1843** The first Police Station built on Police Point which later became Warland Reserve. The Aboriginal word Poltong was used for this area.
- **1844** A wind powered flour mill was built at Encounter Bay by Porter Helmore. It later became part of a private residence in Gibson St.
- **1846** The first church, the Tabernacle, was built for Newland's congregation at Yilki (Yilki, Yelki, Yeilkey, Aboriginal for place by the sea).
- 1847 The road from Adelaide to Victor Harbor via Pt Elliot was opened.

Fountain Inn, which replaced the Ship Inn at Yilki, was opened. It was closed as a hotel in 1870 and purchased for use as a private residence in 1894 by Dr Jefferis. The Inn was used for early District Council meetings.

- 1851 Pt Elliot was selected as the port for the Murray trade and proclaimed as a town.
- 1853 The first District Council of Encounter Bay was formed and met at Pt Elliot.

A road connecting Goolwa and Victor Harbor was opened.

1854 The small jetty at the Bluff was built.

A **railway for a horse drawn tram was** completed between the Ports of Goolwa and Pt Elliot. This was the first public railway in Australia.

- **1855** Edward Truslove built a store and Post Office on the corner of Bay Rd and Maude St, Encounter Bay.
- **1859 Huge losses from a bushfire** that decimated farms in Hindmarsh Valley and through the hinterland of Pt Elliot and Middleton.
- **1862** Victor Harbor chosen as the Port in preference to Pt Elliot. The Government laid **strong moorings** on the seabed near Granite Island.

1863 The town of Victor Harbor was surveyed and the first stone buildings were constructed.

Victor Harbor House licensed as a hotel.

Road connecting Victor Harbor and Yankalilla was opened.

Two river bridges were opened, the Alexandra Bridge over the Hindmarsh and the Newland Bridge over the Inman.

Coolanine copper mine worked on the Bluff.

1864 Railway extension from Pt Elliot completed and the goods shed was built.

First vessel to arrive direct from overseas.

Victoria Pier, which had cost £8 800, was opened.

1865 Port Victor proclaimed.

South Australian Bank opened in Coral St. The building was later used by the Union Bank.

General store was opened by Henry Sparkes. It was built to two storeys by William Heggaton in 1868. Philip Wheaton became the owner in 1870 and in 1894 it was sold to David Bell. Known as Bells for many years.

Crown Hotel built and licensed as a hotel.

1866 The Harbourmaster and Collector of Customs House was built.

The Telegraph Station and Post Office building was built in Coral Street.

The first vessel sailed from Port Victor directly for overseas.

The Southern Argus newspaper began circulation with news items covering an area from Strathalbyn through to Yankalilla.

1867 A liquid tan factory and a sawmill were established in McKinlay St.

Davies shoe shop was opened on Railway Tce.

1868 Mr R B Williams appointed as the first Harbourmaster.

Landseer and Read established wool stores beside the railway on Flinders Pde.

The Cut Hill retaining wall on the Adelaide Rd was completed.

- **1869** Newland Memorial Congregational Church completed by July 19 and St Augustine's Church of England finished on Dec 11.
- **1872** After a brief revival of the whaling industry, the last whale was caught off Victor.
- **1874** First licensed school in the town was opened in Alexandra Cottage by William Evans. Later the site of the Ambulance Station.
- **1875** Jetty extended to Granite Island to become the Causeway. The Working Jetty was built.
- **1876** The first guesthouse, Gertymore (Smugglers), was built by the Baaner family in Crozier Rd.
- **1877** The first public school was opened in Torrens St.

- **1878** Work commenced on the Screwpile Jetty and the Breakwater. This was completed in 1882.
- **1880 Mt Breckan was built** for Alexander Hay at a cost of £10 000. It burned down in 1909 and rebuilding commenced in 1913.
- 1885 Railway to Victor Harbor converted to steam.
- 1892 First lighthouse operated from Granite Island.
- **Adare was built** for the Cudmore family. It incorporated the original home of John Hindmarsh.
- **1894** Horse drawn tram commenced running to Granite Island. Tim Mahoney first driver (charge 3 pence return).
- 1896 The Grosvenor Hotel was built for the Humberstone family.
- **1902 Plaque on the Bluff** was unveiled by Lord Tennyson to commemorate the meeting of Flinders and Baudin.
- **1904/05** Victor Harbor Town Hall built next to the Institute building which had been built in 1877/78. The Institute building served at various times as a Corporation office, Library, RSL Museum and is now an Art Gallery.
- 1910 Higher Primary classes were started at the Public School.

High School classes were first established in the Wonderview Theatre on Flinders Pde and later in the Newland Memorial Church Hall. The High School building was opened in 1937.

Warringa (Anchorage) was built.

Kiosk built on Granite Is.

Bowling green opened.

1911 Foundation of the Victor Harbor Golf Club.

Customs House and Harbourmaster's residence became the Stationmaster's house.

1912 Victor Harbor Times published its first newspaper.

A new Police Station was built in Ocean St and the original one was demolished.

1914 Corporation of the Town of Victor Harbor was proclaimed.

Work started on the Hindmarsh Valley Reservoir. It was completed in 1917 and provided the first piped water to the town.

- 1917 Work, mainly voluntary, began on the Soldiers Memorial Gardens, Flinders Pde.
- **A Delco electric light plant** was installed for street lighting in Flinders Parade.
- **1920** Capt Harry Butler piloted the first plane to Victor Harbor.
- 1921 The Post Office in Ocean St was completed.

The town's name was gazetted as Victor Harbor rather than Port Victor.

- St Joan of Arc Catholic Church was built in Seaview Rd.
- 1922 A volunteer fire Brigade was formed.

Victoria Pier was commenced.
